MFAG reorganises its sales operations

Mitteldeutsche Flughafen AG (MFAG) has reorganised and restructured its sales operations. Kira Fabiunke and Steffen Böttger took over the "Sales Airlines" and the "Sales Cargo" departments on 1 July. Both of them will report to Frank Pieper, who himself took over the leadership of the "Business Development and Strategy" division on 1 April this year.

Kira Fabiunke will be responsible for the "Sales Airlines" department as its manager. Steffen Böttger is taking over the management responsibility in the "Sales Cargo" department. Both of them have proven sales and airline expertise and formerly worked for Air Berlin or Lufthansa: Kira Fabiunke can look back on 15 years of sales work and many years of experience in domestic and international business travel and airline sales work. Steffen Böttger worked until recently as the "Head of Customer Service" at PortGround and therefore has broad operating experience in freight handling too. Prior to this, Steffen Böttger spent many years working in sales and key account management at Boeing and Lufthansa, both of which are companies with international operations.

Frank Pieper, the Head of the Business Development & Strategy division, underlines the importance of this development. "I'm convinced that this new personnel restructuring process will bring a breath of fresh air to our operations, which is what we need to be successful in the long term. We'll continue to work hard and focus on our strengths in order to offer our customers the best possible services. I'd like to thank all those involved on the Executive Board, in the personnel department and particularly at PortGround, who have supported this development in a very constructive and cooperative manner."

Mitteldeutsche Flughafen AG has three subsidiaries: Leipzig/Halle Airport, Dresden Airport and PortGround. Leipzig/Halle registered about 1.56 million passengers and approx. 1.5 million tonnes of air freight in 2022. This makes Leipzig/Halle Germany's second-largest cargo airport. The airport is connected to the A9 and A14 motorways and has a railway station that forms an integral part of the central terminal. This ensures that passengers from Central Germany and beyond can reach the airport directly.

About 841,500 passengers passed through Dresden Airport in 2022. A link to the A4 motorway and a local railway station in the terminal ensure that passengers from the catchment areas in Saxony, southern Brandenburg, the north of the Czech Republic and western Poland can easily reach the airport and leave it again.

PortGround offers ground, freight and other extensive handling services at Leipzig/Halle and Dresden Airports round the clock.
